

A survivor's guide to next steps

You report your experience to OSUPD.



A report is filed.



You are interviewed by an investigator, and you choose how you want to proceed.



You can proceed in three ways: criminally, administratively or you can decline to proceed.



**Criminally
Press Charges**



**Administratively/
Support Services (OSU)**



**Declining
to Proceed**



The police will move forward with interviews of suspects, witnesses and friends. They will also gather any evidence through social media and surveillance cameras, and possibly file a protection order. Investigators will submit the case to the Payne County District Attorney for review.



A report is sent to Student Support and Conduct. Accommodations can be requested (assistance with classes, housing, victim advocate, etc.). You will be given sexual assault packet and information about counseling services. A no contact order will be put into place.



The incident is documented. You do not wish to press charges, so the report stays in the OSU PD record system, and you sign a declination letter.



The case is presented to the District Attorney for declination to be finalized.
